Our play grounds and exercise equipment are now closed but our parks and green spaces are open for people to take their daily exercise whether this be walking or running. Residents of Earley can also contact the Earley Help Hub which has been set up to link volunteers with local needs. They can assist with collection of shopping and prescriptions, can provide a friendly chat or a listening ear and can be contacted on 07493 784091. As the Mayor of Earley, I would like to thank all key workers for their hard work, help and support at this time.
