## **HAVE YOUR SAY ON WBC'S DRAFT LEISURE STRATEGY**

Wokingham Borough Council has launched a consultation on its draft Leisure Strategy for 2021-2025, and wants to hear residents' views on its proposals.

The strategy sets out plans to support residents physical and emotional wellbeing through the council's own leisure offering and through effective partnerships with a wide range of other organisations. This includes proposals to establish a new 'Active Wokingham' Partnership to support collective efforts to ensure that high quality facilities and opportunities remain affordable, accessible, and sustainable.

The strategy also support the council's community vision for Wokingham Borough to 'be a great place to live, learn, work, and grow and a great place to do business.' Physical activity and sports play a fundamental role in this vision and supports the health and emotional well-being of the borough's residents.

The significant health benefits of physical activity are universal, from the very young to the elderly - helping to raise achievement in schools, enabling self-care for those with long-term conditions and helping to prevent mental and physical illness across all age-groups. This is why increasing levels of participation in sports and active leisure pursuits, and reducing the numbers of people who are inactive, is so important.

The strategy outlines four key priorities:

- Promoting health and wellbeing to residents
- Raising participation and reducing levels of inactivity
- Maintain and extend accessibility to indoor leisure facilities
- Maintain and extend accessibility to outdoor spaces
