“Every death and serious injury on the road is a preventable tragedy and yet, on average, five people die every day on the road in the UK and 82 are seriously injured (10-year average from 2013-2022).” (Source: Brake, road safety charity)

”**One thousand, seven hundred and eleven (1,711) people died on British roads in 2022** — an increase of 10% on figures from 2021. Of those, three hundred and three (303) people died because drivers were travelling above the speed limit — an increase of 20% compared to the year before.

In Great Britain in 2022, 303 people were killed in collisions involving someone exceeding the speed limit, with a further **2,180 people seriously injured and 5,648 slightly injured.**” (Source: RoSPA, 2022)
