7.1 <u>Centrepoint Community Centre</u>

The Earley Repair Café, held on the second Sunday of each month, continues to be very popular with volunteers and residents, with over 40 items being brought in to each session and a repair success rate of over 50%.

The weekly youth club sessions are well attended, youngsters take part in a range of activities including visits to a local park in the nicer weather. The Youth Working Group will be meeting to discuss possible expansion of the youth provision.
